We work throughout the year to assess the needs of poor and minorities in poverty struck areas of India and develop projects based on their needs. We have a dedicated team of visionary leaders on site in India working to improve social and economic status of the beneficiaries so that minorities & poor in India can have the opportunities to reach their full potential, contribute to society, live and work in dignity.

IREC makes sure that all the contributions from its donors are utilized in an efficient way so that the entire amount of your donations reaches the beneficiaries.

Transparency and accountability is paramount to everything that we do as an organization.

Following is a detailed annual report of the support programs and activities undertaken by IREC during the year 2017.

# **IREC Activities and Programs**

## **1. Tuition Assistance Program**

### **Synopsis:**

Education support program is a hallmark program of IREC that is geared towards utilizing your valuable donations in creating an independent and self-sustaining generation of individuals. The focus of this program is to help the gifted children of poor and destitute families in achieving their dream of higher education. The results have been very encouraging year after year and we are able to see these students progress and move towards success

Funding is provided in the form of total annual fees to individuals from Primary school to Degree programs including medical school. Funds are paid directly to the educational institution towards tuition fees. Given the sensitivity and seriousness of this program, we take this to the next level by closely monitoring the performance of the students that are benefitted by your funds. To keep the students motivated and on track for the best utilization of your funds, grades are monitored on a regular basis. Counseling is provided to students to keep them on track to succeed.

Out of the total of 112 student beneficiaries, 74 students maintain a meritorious grade of A+ & A.

## **2. After School Coaching Program**

In the year 2016 we initiated after school board examination coaching program with 174 students at two different locations. Due to the overwhelming response and very encouraging results we have initiated a third location in 2017 with the total number of students exceeding 230 in all three locations combined. For this program we hire highly qualified and experienced teachers who help in improving the performance of the students to succeed in board exams.

### 4. Rural Area Schools Staffing Program

Rural area schools do not have the required teachers due to lack of funds. The children are impacted due to this gap in resource. IREC supports school management to hire full time teachers to fill this gap. This critical program has very far reaching benefits in terms of helping the entire rural community. It helps the students with the much needed teaching staff. It also helps well qualified individuals find a job in their local community and contribute to the development of the students.

### Synopsis:

Medical emergencies can turn into critical life and death situations. These can alter the family structure and also cause an immense financial stress. With the development of technology, the costs of medical treatment have significantly increased making it harder for the people.

Our 2017 medical support program has seen a significant growth in the number of beneficiaries compared to the year 2016. People who are not able to afford treatment reach out to IREC for help with various medical conditions. We provide the necessary guidance and financial help to these ailing patients. Funds are paid directly to the hospitals and pharmacies towards their bills and cost of medications.

## 6. Orphan and Poor Girls Marriage Support

Providing financial support for the marriage of orphan girls and girls belonging to poor families is another highly successful program run by IREC. After an application is received, IREC and its dedicated volunteers thoroughly verify the financial status of the girls we support for marriage. Money is disbursed to highly deserving girls and is spent only on absolute necessities of the marriage.

During 2017 financial year IREC was able to identify and support 15 marriages, out of which 6 were orphan girls, 7 girls belonging to poor families and 2 girls of handicapped parents. This support, provided in the form of financial aid, was determined on a case by case basis. A total of Rs. 231,500 was utilized to support this noble cause.

## 7. Widow and Destitute Families Support

Monetary support to the widows, orphans and destitute families is another way IREC utilizes your donations. The beneficiaries are identified by going through a verification and screening process that includes visiting the houses and verifying their living conditions and socio economic status. Once a family is identified as a deserving recipient of your monthly donations, IREC will provide a monthly support to meet the basic household expenses. The amount is determined on the basis of family size and their needs. These payments are deposited directly to the bank accounts of the beneficiaries.

During 2017, IREC supported 24 families disbursing a total of Rs 596,000 throughout the year.

## 8. Rohingya Refugee Support Program

Recent times have seen the very unfortunate influx of Rohingya refugees in India. IREC has utilized your donations to provide immediate help to these refugees. Emergency medical care, monthly food packets, blankets and other basic living necessities are some of the ways we have provided support to our displaced brothers and sisters.

IREC supported 178 refugee families for a total cost of Rs 228,400 during the year 2017.

## 9. Ramadan Food Drive Program

During Ramadan 2017, Alhamdulillah we were able to distribute food supplies to 296 families. These families are comprised mostly of widows and orphans as identified by the volunteers of IREC.

Also in 2017, by the mercy of Allah, Your donations to IREC put smiles on the faces of 117 orphan children who were gifted with new clothes for Eid celebration.


## 10. Bore Wells and Construction Programs

There are many rural areas that struggle for drinking water. Families have to travel long distances to get a pot of water. IREC identifies such areas and constructs bore wells to benefit local population.

Each bore well costs Rs 67,000 (Approximately \$1000) to install. We plan to continue this project in the future with generous contribution from donors like you and our goal is to reach more rural areas that are desperate without water.
