These programs are lifelines—bringing dignity, stability, and hope where it is needed most. With a fully volunteer-driven structure, 100% of your donations reach the beneficiaries.

EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT

For many students, financial hardship threatens to end their education long before their potential is realized. In 2025, IREC supported **874** students, ensuring their learning journeys did not stop due to lack of resources.

This support opened doors to Engineering, Medicine, and other professional fields, allowing students to focus on their studies instead of financial stress. For families, it brought relief and renewed hope; for students, it meant believing that their dreams were still within reach.

Each student supported carries forward not only personal ambition, but the promise of a stronger and more hopeful future for their community



HOSPITAL CONSTRUCTION

In 2025, construction of the Sahara Medical Center continued to make steady progress, with the **Phase 4** structure successfully completed. This milestone brings the project significantly closer to becoming fully operational

To date, IREC has invested \$225,000 toward the construction of this vital healthcare facility. Once completed, the Sahara Medical Center will serve over **500,000** people living in surrounding communities, where no hospital exists within a **20**-kilometer radius.

For families in this region, access to medical care often means long travel, high costs, or delayed treatment. This hospital will bridge that gap—bringing essential, life-saving healthcare closer to home and offering dignity, hope, and timely care to those who need it most.



+ MEDICAL SUPPORT

For many families, the cost of medical care is simply beyond reach. In **2025**, IREC supported 15 critical surgeries, giving patients a chance at recovery and renewed life

In addition, **129** individuals received monthly medicine support, helping them manage ongoing health conditions they could not otherwise afford.

This consistent care reduced suffering and brought stability to families facing long-term illness. For those who had nowhere else to turn, IREC’s medical support meant relief from pain, restored dignity, and hope for a healthier tomorrow.

Social Welfare Programs

In 2025, IREC’s social welfare initiatives supported vulnerable families through monthly pensions, ration and food assistance, clothing distribution, education aid, medical help, Poor Girls Marriage Support, Ramadan Support through the distribution of Ramadan kits and Small Business Support.



WIDOWS & ORPHANS SUPPORT

In 2025, IREC supported **5616** widows and orphaned individuals with monthly ration supplies and pension assistance, helping families meet their most basic needs during times of deep hardship. During Ramadan, additional ration and food support ensured that families could observe the month with dignity and comfort.

These programs brought full meals, peace of mind, and renewed hope to families in need.



In addition, **300** orphaned and deserving children received clothing, bringing warmth, dignity, and the comfort of feeling cared for. For many children, this was more than clothing—it was the joy of owning something new, the confidence to attend school without hesitation, and the reassurance that they were seen, valued, and not forgotten.

This simple act of care restored smiles, strengthened self-worth, and reminded each child that they matter.



WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT

IREC Women's Empowerment Program focuses on creating pathways for women to move toward independence and self-confidence.

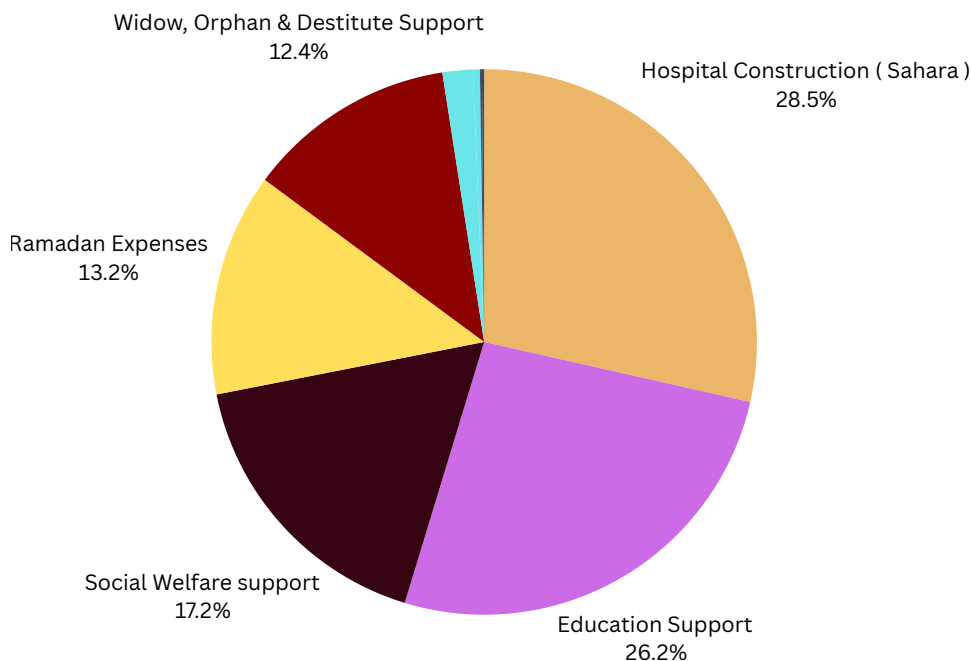
Through hands-on training and certification-based skill development,
